Your Express Steam Locomotives



7029 'Clun Castle'

7029 Clun Castle was built in 1950 by British Railways to Charles Collett's 1923 Great Western Railway design. A history maker in her own right, Clun's epic runs as the last of her class in regular service at the end of steam, ensured her preservation at Tyseley.

5043 'Earl of Mount Edgcumbe'

5043 is Vintage Trains' second member of the Castle Class. She was built in 1936 and so is an authentic Great Western Railway locomotive. Like Clun, the Earl is another history maker including generating a power output believed to be a record for the Castles and even exceeding the diesel hydraulics that replaced steam in the Western Region.



45596 'Bahamas'

Bahamas is a Jubilee class locomotive constructed in 1934 by the North British Locomotive Company in Glasgow for the LMS.

First Class

Travel in one of our first class carriages at tables for 4, tables for 2 or up to 6 people in a private compartment. Reservations at tables for two and for private compartments may be made on payment of a supplement.

Tourist

Seating arranged around tables for four people. You can pre-order bacon rolls (morning only) or afternoon tea (afternoon only), for an additional charge, delivered to your seat, including a cup of tea or coffee. A buffet car is also available on-board offering light refreshments.

A journey through the Warwickshire Countryside

The Shakespeare Express runs from Birmingham Snow Hill, Derby, Leicester and Worcester Shrub Hill calling at pick-up stations en-route to Stratford-upon-Avon.

The journey runs at express speeds either along the Shakespeare Line, the original Great Western line connecting Birmingham and Stratford, or the Chiltern Mainline, in each direction through city townscapes and Warwickshire countryside.

Passengers looking for something special can travel in Pullman, offering at table service of a Full English Breakfast to Stratford before an Afternoon Tea on the return, with tea and coffee served during your journey.

The Shap Mountaineer

Saturday 29th March

Departing from Birmingham New Street, Wolverhampton, Stafford, Crewe, Warrington Bank Quay, Preston (pick up) & Blackburn (set down)



We start the year with a trip to Carlisle, a 2000 year old city with plenty of history to discover. While the city is famous for Hadrian's Wall, there is much more besides including the Cathedral, Castle and several museums and galleries all for you to explore.

The journey will see the train make a thunderous ascent of Shap to Carlisle, Bahama's first run on this route in preservation, before returning via the stunning and world-famous Settle & Carlisle line. Both on the outward run via Shap and the return over the Settle & Carlisle, Bahamas will be unassisted by a diesel locomotive.

The North Wales Coast Express

Saturday 3rd May

Departing from Birmingham New Street, Coleshill Parkway, Nuneaton, Tamworth, Lichfield Trent Valley, Stafford & Crewe



This train will be steam hauled up the West Coast Mainline to Chester and then by diesel to Llandudno, where passengers can alight for the town's annual transport festival or to explore the rest of the town. The return journey will be entirely steam hauled.

The Llandudno Transport Festival is the largest in Wales and one of the UK's best-loved events, held in conjunction with the Victorian Extravaganza. Costume, vintage fairground and a host of attractions combine in a unique annual celebration of transport and entertainment heritage within the town.

The town also boasts a Victorian Pier and its own mini-mountain, Great Orme, which can be walked up or why not take the historic Great Orme Tramway.

A returning favourite, The Whistling Ghost, sees this steam hauled express head south to the West Country, giving passengers the opportunity to enjoy an early Summer Saturday on the way to the Somerset seaside town of Minehead. Included with your ticket is the trip along the West Somerset Railway, offering passengers a relaxing journey through the Somerset countryside before alighting at Minehead. The return journey will see the train storm the famous 1-in-37 Lickey Incline.

The Cathedrals Express to Swansea

Saturday 5th July

Departing from Birmingham New Street, Barnt Green,
Worcestershire Parkway, Cheltenham & Gloucester



The Cathedrals Express will depart from Birmingham and head to Swansea via Chepstow, allowing travellers a scenic journey as the route follows the Western banks of River Severn. Originally the main route into Wales from London before the construction of the Severn Tunnel, this train will commemorate the 175th anniversary of the route between Chepstow and Swansea opening, connecting it to the wider GWR network.

At Swansea passengers will have time to take in the sweeping waterfront of Swansea Bay leading to Mumbles and onto the beautiful Gower Peninsula. Not complete without trying one of the famous Welsh-Italian ice cream parlours. The return journey will see the train storm the famous 1-in-37 Lickey Incline.
